Rationale behind the second SHARE Policy Dialogue

Placing Students at the Centre: The Role of Degree Structures and Learning Outcomes in ASEAN

Bangkok, 24-25 February 2016

The nature of higher education has been changing everywhere in the world. Once an 'elite' education landscape preparing a small stratum of society for academic careers, increasingly it is reaching out to a diverse student body with varied social and educational backgrounds. As global systems evolve, how can mass higher education provide student centred learning and flexible study career paths? How can it concurrently respond to the different individual motivations and talents of students, while taking into account rapid changes in the labour market and the need for active citizenship? These questions are increasingly at the heart of international higher education reform processes. This Policy Dialogue will specifically address developments in ASEAN and Europe that are focused on putting the 'student at the centre' of reform in degree structures, teaching and learning.

Organised as part of the project 'European Union Support to Higher Education in ASEAN Region' (SHARE), this Policy Dialogue is taking forward the debate on how degrees and degree structures in ASEAN are defined, and whether they allow the flexible study pathways that society and knowledge based economies demand. It will spotlight student centred learning and learning outcomes, but also address issues of recognition and mobility, drawing upon the results of two studies conducted by the project on degree structures and qualifications frameworks in ASEAN. Following the success of SHARE's inaugural Policy Dialogue on 'Enhancing Connectivity and Comparability in ASEAN Higher Education' (Jakarta, 24-25 August 2015), this second Policy Dialogue event, is organised by the SHARE implementing consortium in collaboration with the ASEAN University Network (AUN) and hosted by Chulalongkorn University.

The second SHARE Policy Dialogue brings together some 130 participants from the academic community in ASEAN, including HE regional organisations, the ASEAN Secretariat, national ministries and policy makers, national university associations, university leadership, student representatives as well as some practitioners involved in recognition, mobility and programme design. The rich diversity of our audience will generate both institutional, student and policy perspectives on the issues. A number of European speakers and institutions will also share their experiences, drawing upon their participation within the European Higher Education Area.



Reflecting upon the inaugural SHARE Policy Dialogue

Enhancing Connectivity and Comparability in ASEAN Higher Education

Jakarta, 24-25 August 2015

Creating an ASEAN higher education space plays a pivotal role in achieving ASEAN's overall aspirations of connectivity between the peoples of the region. The first in a series of SHARE's policy dialogues was hosted by the ASEAN Secretariat in Jakarta, Indonesia and brought together senior national ASEAN policymakers in higher education, leading representatives of regional organisations, relevant donor agencies, and distinguished academics from universities across the ASEAN region. The purpose was to position the EU-funded SHARE programme well within the existing landscape as regards existing Quality Assurance, Qualification Frameworks and Credit Transfer System initiatives, to facilitate exchange of information from Asia and Europe, and explore synergies that will enhance connectivity and comparability in ASEAN Higher Education.

The two-day event featured keynote plenaries with distinguished speakers from government and regional bodies, interactive multi-stakeholder panel discussions featuring higher education experts from across Asia and Europe, a networking dinner, breakout tracks debating QA, QF and the fostering of student mobility, concluding with a plenary on collective perspectives around challenges and future tasks. As a result, there was a common understanding that universities and student representatives are to play a key role in developing an ASEAN dimension in higher education. The policy dialogue further agreed that learning outcomes should be placed at the heart of on-going efforts to raise quality of university courses and make them regionally comparable, in order to stimulate student mobility.

Further achievements of the inaugural SHARE Policy Dialogue included :

- Initial mapping results regarding various capacity building and regional cooperation measures in higher education in ASEAN.
- In-depth analyses of the central pillars of a higher education comparability process (QA, QF, credit transfer).
- Stimulating dialogue and capturing of expertise on goals and strategies required to achieve comparability and connectivity of ASEAN's Higher Education sector, including a focus on Cambodia, Lao PDR, Myanmar and Vietnam.
- Contributing a coordinated approach towards regional higher education by providing an opportunity for donors and international organisations to work on mapping existing regional initiatives and projects.
- Identifying measures to strengthen student and staff mobility within ASEAN.
- Disseminating the debate and result to a wider audience through digital platforms and our consortium's communication channels.

The event's key findings on student involvement and learning outcomes have informed the planning for SHARE's second Policy Dialogue on Placing Students at the Centre: The Role of Degree Structures and Learning Outcomes in ASEAN in Bangkok, Thailand on 24-25 February 2016.

Arthakaivalvatee**

ASEAN Deputy Secretary-General for
the ASEAN Socio-Cultural Community

H.E. Vongthep Arthakaivalvatee is the Deputy Secretary General (DSG) of ASEAN for Socio-Cultural Community. Prior to this appointment, H.E. Vongthep Arthakaivalvatee was assigned as Director, International Affairs Division, Office of the Permanent Secretary at Ministry of Justice of Thailand.

He started his career in the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Thailand from 1994 to 2008, including postings at the Royal Thai Embassy in Kuwait and the Permanent Mission of Thailand to the United Nations Office and Other International Organizations at Vienna, Austria. He was Thailand's chief negotiator in the Commission on Crime Prevention and Criminal Justice (CCPCJ) and served as Vice Chairman of the 50th session of Commission on Narcotic Drugs (CND) as well as Alternate Governor in the Board of the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA). At headquarters, he served in the Departments of International Organizations, Information and Economic Affairs, dealing with such global issues as human rights, sustainable development and environment.

In 2009, he joined the Ministry of Justice of Thailand in charge of a special project to develop the United Nations Rules for the Treatment of Women Prisoners, also known as the "Bangkok Rules" and was subsequently appointed Director, Office of External Relations and Policy Coordination, Thailand Institute of Justice (2012-2014). In that capacity, he also served as Principal Advisor to the Chairperson of the 21st session of the CCPCJ while playing a key role in promoting the rule of law, crime prevention and criminal justice in the post-2015 development agenda.



H.E. Jesús Miguel Sanz

Ambassador – Head of the Delegation of
the European Union to Thailand and
Laos

Ambassador Sanz started his assignment as Head of the Delegation of the European Union to the Kingdom of Thailand and to the Lao PDR in 2013. A Spanish national, he began his career in the Spanish Diplomatic Service in 1992. His most recent appointment was as Spanish Ambassador to New Zealand, the Cook Islands, Fiji, Kiribati, Samoa and Tonga from 2011 to 2013.

During his extensive career, he has held the position of Spanish Governor to ASEF and Director General of "Casa Asia" or Asia House from 2007 to 2011. He was Counsellor – Senior Advisor at the Office of the Minister of Foreign Affairs and Cooperation in Madrid from 2006 to 2007. He served from 2003 to 2006 as Political Counsellor at the Spanish Embassy in Beijing and during this period he was appointed as Coordinator of Spanish Aid in the Thailand Tsunami crisis.

President of Chulalongkorn University

Professor Pirom Kamolratanakul, M.D., M.Sc, is a President of Chulalongkorn University and also a Member of the National Legislative Assembly from 2014 until present. He earned a Bachelor's Degree in Medicine from Chulalongkorn University in 1972, and he continued his studies for a Master's Degree in Clinical Epidemiology from Mc Master University, Canada in 1983 and another Master's Degree in Clinical Epidemiology from the University of Pennsylvania, USA, in 1990.

His career at Chulalongkorn University started in 1992 as a Professor in the Department of Preventive and Social Medicine. He then became Dean of the Faculty of Medicine from 1999 – 2007. In addition to his professional works, he served as Director of King Chulalongkorn Memorial Hospital, the Thai Red Cross Society, Bangkok, from 1999 – 2007 and also an advisor to the Minister of Public Health.

He has been presented with many prizes and awards, such as the National Outstanding Epidemiologist in 2008 from the Preventive Medicine Association of Thailand and also received a Doctoral degree (Honoris Causa) from Kansai University, Japan. He has published 112 research publications whose topics are involved with, for example, Epidemiology and Economic Evaluation on Tropical Diseases, etc. His other works include 24 books and book chapters as well as 23 academic articles.

Prof. Anne Scott

Executive Dean,
Liverpool John Moores University

Anne Scott has been Dean of the Faculty of Education, Health and Community Liverpool John Moores University since August 2014. Immediately prior to this she was Professor of Nursing and Deputy President and Registrar, Dublin City University (DCU). During her time as Deputy President and Registrar (2006-2012) Anne led significant curriculum reform across Dublin City University including the development of the graduate attributes project, embedding of learning outcomes and roll out of the new academic framework in DCU, development and embedding of new marks and standards for the institution and the development of an e-learning roadmap for the institution.

Anne's research interests include the ethics domain of health care practice, the philosophy and ethics of health care, judgement and decision-making in clinical practice and health services research - focusing on the health work force. Anne was the Irish lead on the EU funded RN4CAST project and her recent publication investigating links between nurse patient ratios, nurse education and patient outcomes, with Aiken and colleagues, has received international acclaim.

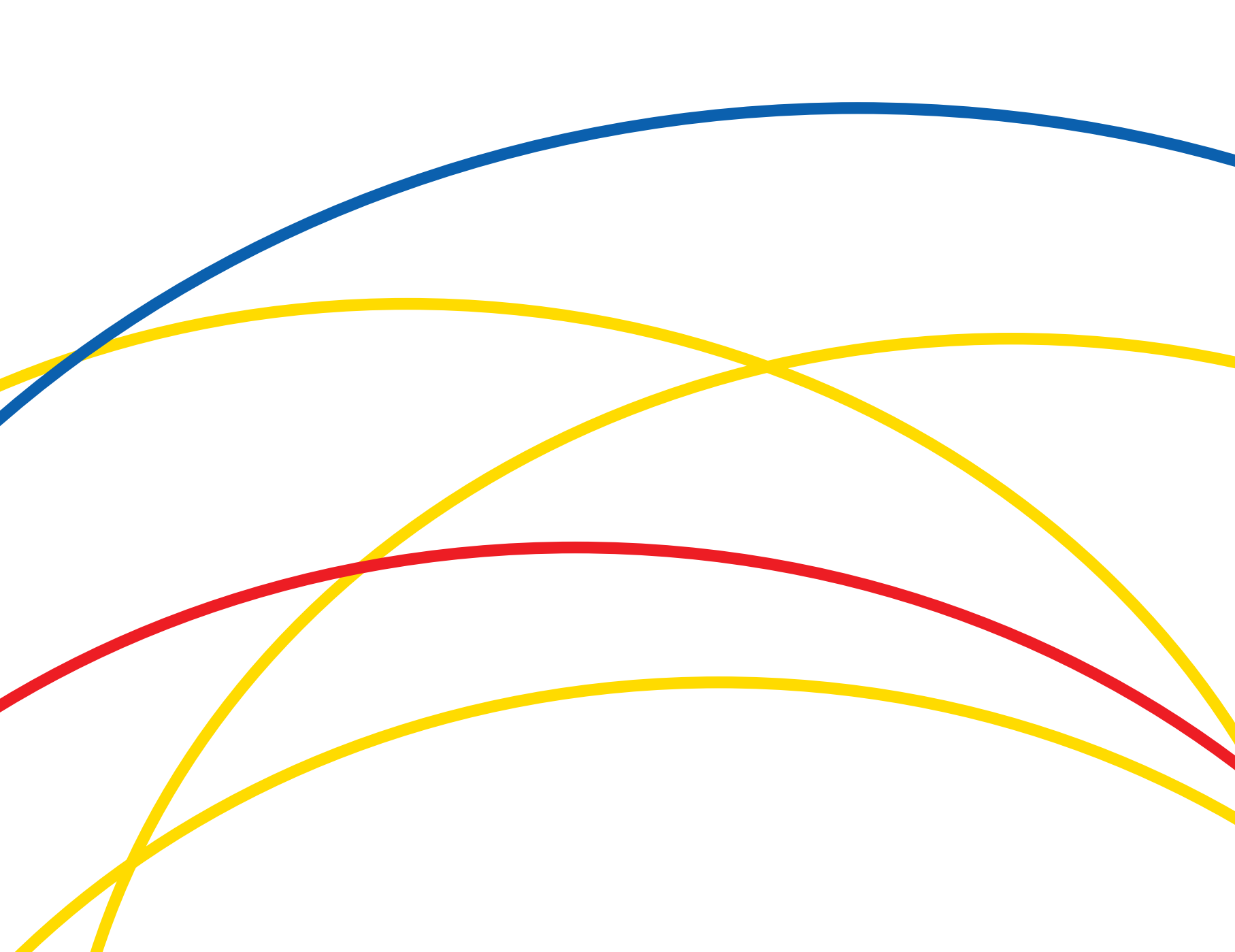


Thidawan Pranseree

A consortium led by the British Council and composed of Campus France, the German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD), EP-Nuffic, the European Association for Quality Assurance in Higher Education (ENQA) and the European University Association (EUA) are working with ASEAN counterparts to implement SHARE from 2015 to 2019.

The EU-funded programme has the broad remit to strengthen regional cooperation, enhance the quality, competitiveness and internationalisation of ASEAN higher education institutions and students, contributing to an ASEAN Community beyond 2015. SHARE's work can be grouped in the following result areas:

- **Policy Dialogues:** in support of connectivity and comparability across higher education in the ASEAN region with policy-makers as well as technical specialists and the academic community.
- **Qualifications Frameworks:** supporting the ASEAN Qualifications Reference Framework (AQRF) and the work of the related AQRF Task Force with a focus on higher education.
- **Quality Assurance:** a combination of European-ASEAN dialogues, framework development, piloting and dissemination activities as well as capacity development measures aim to foster the ASEAN QA Framework in HE (AQAFHE) at regional and national levels. The emphasis is on external quality assurance.
- **ASEAN Credit Transfer System (ACTS) & ASEAN-EU Credit Transfer Systems (AECTS):** The existing Asia-based credit transfer systems (CTS) will be mapped, providing needs identification of ACTS and AECTS in support of their implementation by Higher Education Institutions. The method and instruments for CTS will be designed, including the development of a common platform for online credit transfer, facilitating a pilot of ACTS/AECTS, followed by an evaluation of the results and impact.
- **Student Mobility with Scholarships:** Scholarships will be provided to boost mobility between ASEAN countries and with Europe and test the A(E)CTS and ACTS. A promotion and outreach strategy will be developed and delivered in collaboration with selected HEIs, with monitoring and evaluation (M&E) of the scholarship scheme to capture the experience of students and home/host HEIs, especially in A(E)CTS.

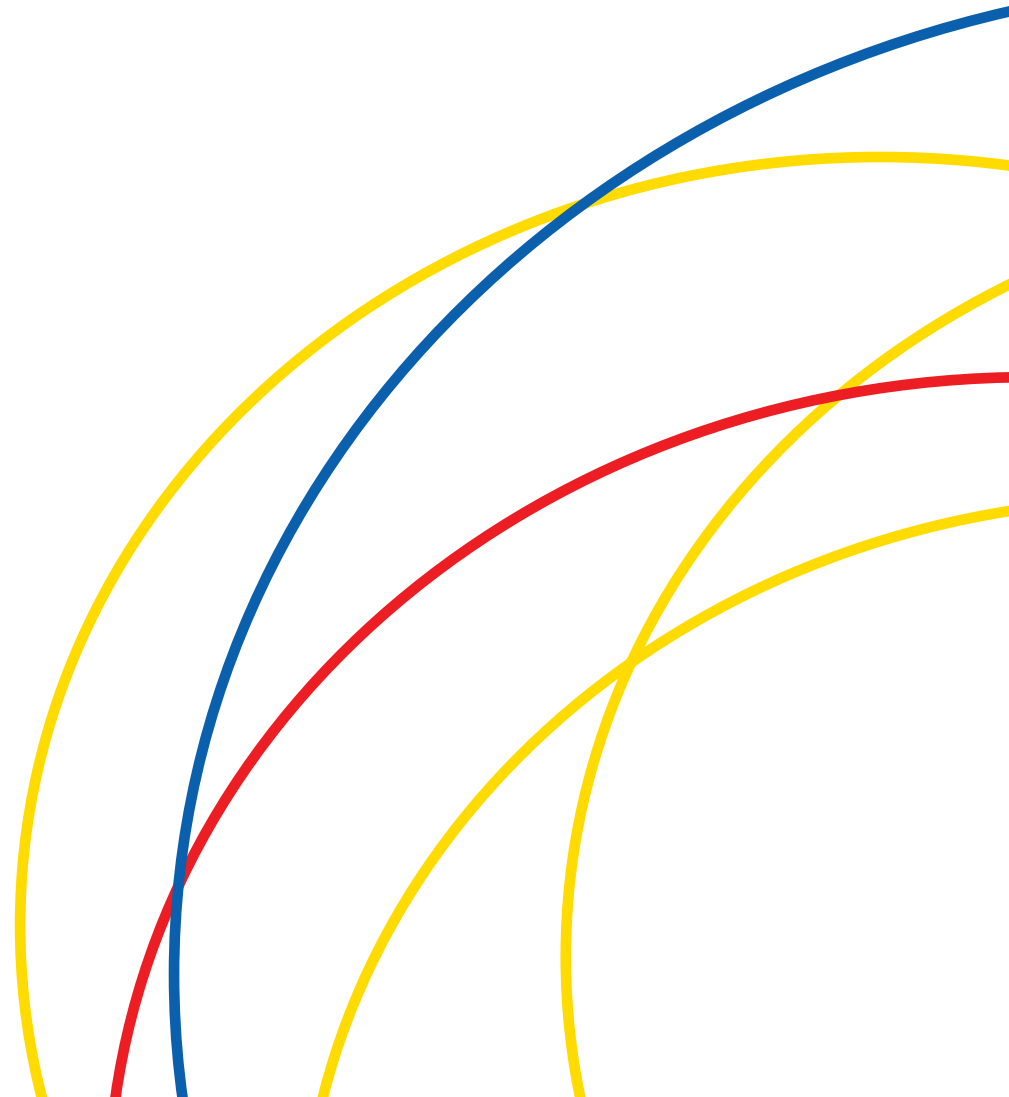
