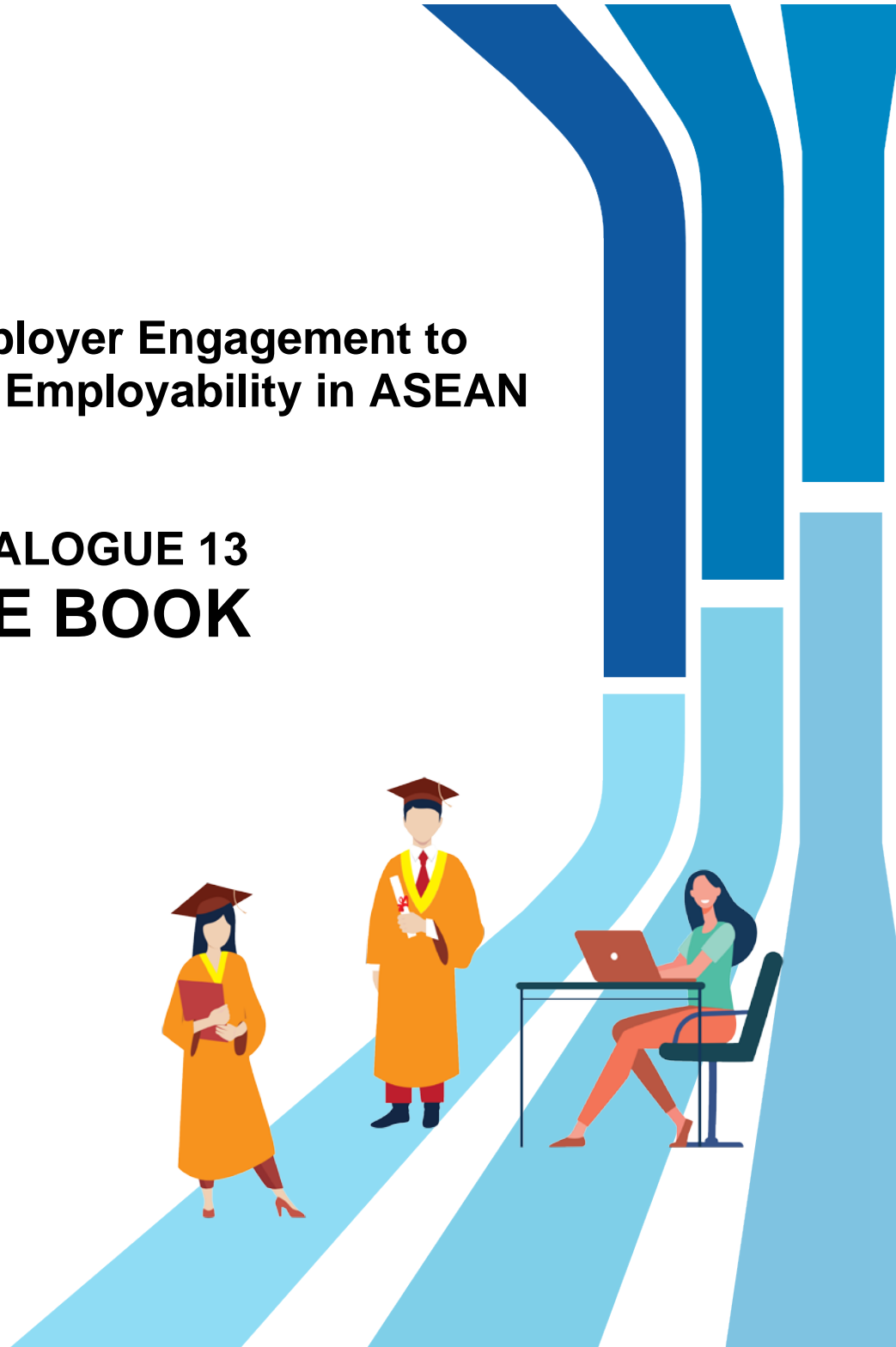




University and Employer Engagement to Enhance Graduate Employability in ASEAN

SHARE POLICY DIALOGUE 13 PROGRAMME BOOK





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I. BACKGROUND

The occasion of the 12th SHARE Policy Dialogue on July 27th, 2021 saw the launch and inaugural meetings of the **ASEAN Working Group on Higher Education Mobility 2025 (AWGHEM)**. The SHARE Programme serves as the Technical and Operational Advisor to the Working Group. The members of the Working Group are expected to contribute to the realisation of the ASEAN Education Work Plan 2021-2025, specifically the activities of **Output 3.2: ‘Sustained and strengthened ASEAN capacity in higher education harmonisation through strategies, mechanisms, and scholarship provision’**. To this end, and within the scope of its mandate, the Working Group wishes to engage representatives of regional employers to provide input on student internships, employability, and potential sources of funding and support for the sustainable implementation of an intra-ASEAN Student Mobility Scholarship.

Young people have been amongst the hardest hit by the COVID-19 pandemic in ASEAN. Their access to education and employment has suffered in addition to their personal and social lives at a critical time in their development. Yet, ASEAN youth have the potential to contribute significantly to job creation, innovation, and advancing the socio-economic progress of ASEAN. Graduate employability is therefore a key issue, when we consider that 34% of the region’s population are between the ages of 15 and 35. In 2017, ASEAN launched the **‘ASEAN Youth Development Index (YDI)’**. In its first phase the ASEAN YDI tracked key indicators across 4 domains, namely: **Education, Health and Well-being, Employment and Opportunity, and Participation and Engagement**. A second phase of ASEAN YDI (YDI-II) report, **‘Understanding How Young People See ASEAN’** sought to define the fifth domain of **‘Awareness, Values and Identity’** amongst ASEAN university students. These 5 domains are the priority areas for the **ASEAN Work Plan on Youth 2021-2025**.

The ASEAN Declaration on Human Resources Development for the Changing World of Work, adopted by the 36th ASEAN Summit on 26th June 2020, resolved to undertake the following:

14. Strengthen cooperation and coordination of relevant ASEAN sectoral bodies, private sector, academia, tripartite partners and other stakeholders to facilitate ASEAN’s coordinated and holistic approach on human resources development; and

15. Strengthen cooperation between ASEAN and ASEAN’s external partners, including international organisations, to facilitate the sharing of models, good practices, and experiences in advancing human resources development in a changing world of work.

These undertakings are taken forward and implemented through strategies and actions outlined in the **Roadmap of the ASEAN Declaration on Human Resources Development for the Changing World of Work 2020 – 2030** within a vision of:

‘An ASEAN workforce that is future ready and equipped with competencies that enable them to actively and effectively contribute to the sustainable development, competitiveness, and resilience of ASEAN.’





II. OBJECTIVES

The 13th Policy Dialogue implemented by the SHARE Programme and its partners brings together key stakeholders to share information, exchange views and propose strategies for university and employer engagement to enhance graduate employability in ASEAN.

The objectives are as follows:

- To understand universities and employers' perceptions of intra-ASEAN mobility graduates and their employability
- To identify ASEAN graduates' perceptions on the skills and resources they have developed as a result of their intra-ASEAN mobility participation
- To explore what steps can be taken to improve intra-ASEAN mobility programmes' contributions to graduate employability in the post-Covid-19 / Industry 4.0 context
- To share and examine recent research on developments in higher education in Southeast Asia commissioned by the SHARE Programme

HE Igor Driesmans has served as the EU Ambassador to ASEAN since 2019. He was previously a Member of the Cabinet of Federica Mogherini, High Representative of the Union for Foreign Affairs and Security Policy/Vice-President of the European Commission. His responsibilities included Asia and Pacific, Cultural Diplomacy, Transport and Fisheries. He previously served as Principal Assistant to the Chief Operating Officer of the European External Action Service (2014), Desk Officer for ASEAN (2013-2014), and Deputy Head of the Political, Economic, Trade and Information Section of the EU Delegation to South Africa (2009-2013). Ambassador Igor Driesmans has been an official of the EU since 2003. He holds a Masters in History from University of Gent (Belgium).

Professor Bernard C Y Tan is Senior Vice Provost (Undergraduate Education) at the National University of Singapore (NUS). He assists the Provost in setting educational directions and policies, and in assuring educational quality for the University.

His achievements include the Public Administration Medal (Silver) in 2012, NUS Outstanding Educator Award in 2004, and NUS Young Researcher Award in 2002. Prof Tan is also Shaw Professor in the Department of Information Systems and Analytics. His research interests include social media, virtual communities, and Internet commerce. He has given invited talks and keynote addresses at various international conferences. His research work has been published in major international journals and conference proceedings in the field of information systems.

Keynote and Q&A: “Casting a vision for future proofing the next generation”

Education Lead, APAC at Microsoft, **Mr. Vincent Quah**



Vincent has more than 30 years of work experiences in the Government, Education, Life Science and Research sectors. He has worked in both the public and private sectors and has had roles ranging from sales, business development, operations, education, research and teaching. Currently, he is Director, Education Industry for Microsoft APAC and he has responsibilities that include strategy development, business development/growth and working to support education customer success in their adoption of Microsoft technologies and platforms. Vincent spends most of his time with senior officials in the Ministry of Education and tertiary education institutions, listening and speaking with stakeholders to understand their needs and requirements. Prior to his current role, Vincent has also spent the bulk of the last 7 years working with customers to accelerate the adoption of cloud technologies to address their digital transformation agendas, be operationally more efficient and effective, and to deliver a higher value to their users. In addition, Vincent has spoken and participated in conferences in more than 15 countries, including Australia, Canada, China, India and Singapore. Vincent was also appointed to the Asia Development Bank’s High Level Advisory Group for Digital Technology in 2019.

Director, Futures Office, National University of Singapore, **Dr. Adrian Kuah**



Adrian Kuah has the kind of career trajectory that calls to mind the phrase “short attention span”. It is also the kind of career path that traditional Asian parents wring their hands and lament about. After a series of twists and turns, Adrian is finally in a job that allows and empowers him to ask inconvenient questions, play the agent provocateur, and irritate the hell out of the NUS senior leadership. Dr Adrian Kuah is the founding director of the Futures Office, National University of Singapore, an internal foresight think-tank tasked to ask fundamental, first-order questions and uncover hidden assumptions to draw insights about possible and plausible futures of higher education. Just prior to that, from 2015 to 2018, he was Senior Research Fellow and Head, Case Studies Unit at the Lee Kuan Yew School of Public Policy. His research interests included futures thinking, education and public policy, and complexity science.

CEO, Accelerate Global, **Ms. Raudhah Nazran**

A Malaysian government scholar, she graduated with honours in Law from the United Kingdom. She cut her teeth in social entrepreneurship while in the UK serving as the President and Team Leader of a UK-based social enterprise for 3 years, managing 104 members from different countries and macro managing five social enterprises. She was the first Asian Muslim female to be appointed to the role by the board of advisors and was the first to win the Enactus President and Team Leader of the





Year award in the UK after successfully leading her team as one of the Top 3 Enactus Social Enterprises in the United Kingdom. Her impact in the UK did not go unnoticed. In 2018, she was called by Lord Michael Hastings to the parliament of the UK to speak and discuss issues surrounding youth unemployment and brought home the International Student of the Year Award. She was also called to speak at the University of Essex United Nations Human Rights Conference in the UK about child's rights to education. Raudhah's footprint in Malaysia is also well established as she's been given a seat in the advisory board of Curriculum Development of the Polytechnic and College Community Malaysia, overseeing the module development for the Certificate of Business Operations, making her the youngest board ever appointed. She was recently interviewed by two Malaysian TV Channels, RTM 1 and Astro Awani. Raudhah was also recognised by Tatler Asia as one of the Gen. T Honouree, Top 400 Asian Young Leaders in 2020 and was also shortlisted for the Women of The Future Southeast Asia Awards 2021. Her most recent recognitions include being invited to speak alongside the Former President of Timor-Leste and Noble Peace Prize Laureate, Dr Jose Ramos-Horta on Ethical Leadership in ASEAN as well as being invited to speak at a policy dialogue organised by the European Union Support to Higher Education in the ASEAN Regions.
